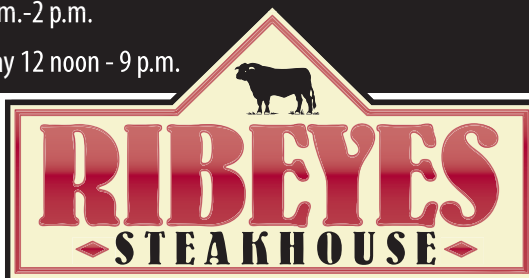

Fun ways to enjoy the great outdoors with kids

The great outdoors can be an inviting place with plenty of opportunities for adventure. It's also a treasure trove of sights and sounds that can serve as a springboard for a lifelong yearning for knowledge.

Children of the 1980s and before may remember long days spent outside with requirements to "come back in when the street lights turn on." - Go camping: Whether you camp in the backyard, in the woods or at a campsite, spending a night immersed in nature can be an unforgettable experience. Camping equipment can be rented or borrowed, if necessary.
- Enjoy a picnic: Bring a meal outdoors to a quiet spot, like a park or garden.
- Take a boat ride: Enjoying the great outdoors from the water brings an entirely new perspective. Purchase tickets for a fishing charter or take a tour of a local waterway.



- Feed ducks or other birds: Children can see wildlife in its natural environment, and provide some supplemental nutrition in the process. Bring along wild birdseed (bread is not a healthy option) and sprinkle some along shorelines or in the water to watch the birds arrive.
- Do a scavenger hunt in nature: While on any excursion, you can engage

in a scavenger hunt. Have a list of five to 10 items to find, such as a pink flower, a leaf with a stem and a black rock. See who can find them all the fastest.

Spending time outdoors provides plenty of opportunities for family-friendly excitement and fun.

Family-friendly resolutions to pursue together

There are plenty of resolutions that families can enjoy together. Undertaking goals as a family unit can create an accountability that keeps everyone on track. Here are some resolutions to think about making right now.

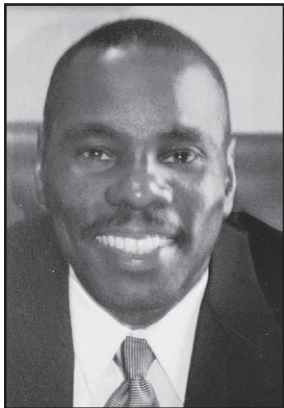

Robert L. Hines' grandfather, L.L. Battle founded Hunter Odom Funeral Services on April 7, 1890.

The funeral home was operated under his name. L.L. Battle died September 3, 1919 and the funeral home became the property of his wife, Mrs. Alice Battle. The funeral home was operated by L.L. Battle's son-in-law, Edward R. Hines until he left Rocky Mount in 1922. Mrs. Alice Battle allowed her nephew, H.S. Sorrell to operate the funeral home as Sorrell's Funeral Home until his death on September 9, 1936.

Edward R. Hines, the son-in-law of L.L. Battle returned from Washing-

ton, D.C. and operated the funeral home until his death in June 1938. After Edward R. Hines' death, Mrs. Sarah Sorrell, the widow of H.S. Sorrell operated the funeral home until she sold the business to W.H. Hunter. This was the first time the business was sold.

W.H. Hunter changed the name of the business to Hunter's Funeral Home. He operated the funeral home until he

sold the business in 1980 to Mr. and Mrs. James E. Odom, who operated the funeral home under the name of Hunter-Odom Funeral Services.

During October 1996, the funeral home was sold to Chester Clack, who operates the funeral home under the name of Hunter-Odom Funeral Home Services.

Tips for choosing a family pet

There are many reasons to welcome a pet into a household. Companionship, unconditional love and protection are some of the reasons people get pets. Parents also may want children to have pets so they develop a sense of caring and responsibility.

When shopping for a new pet, the right fit can make all the difference. Before bringing any animal into a household, it is important to ask a few pointed questions and conduct an honest assessment of various factors that can affect the animal's well-being.

Assess budget first

Pets require different financial commitments. For example, a beta fish in a small tank will cost considerably less than a pet dog or a horse kept at a stable. Adults must consider what they can afford when it comes to pets, as each animal comes with a separate initial price tag and subsequent food and

care costs.

Think about allergies. Dander, hair and feathers can trigger allergic reactions in children and adults, so certain pets may need to be avoided. Speak with a pediatrician or a veterinarian and ask for suggestions on which pets may work best.

Consider a child's developmental stage

Children younger than age five or six may not be mature enough to view the pet as something other than a toy or plaything. Before committing to a pet, particularly one that will serve as a child's companion, be honest about the child's maturity level. Some pets may have easygoing temperaments, like family-friendly dog breeds, including beagles and retrievers. A parrot with a strong nipping instinct or a skittish cat may not be the best fit until children are older.

Look at family lifestyle. Families that go on frequent vacations or are involved in many after-work or extracurricular school activities may not have enough time to devote to pets that thrive on interaction. Rather, a pet that is comfortable in a habitat or cage or one that is mostly self-sufficient might be a better fit.

Research, research, research

Before making a commitment, families should conduct significant research on the pets they are considering. This way there will be fewer surprises. Look at information regarding pet/breed temperament, genetic illness predisposition, exercise requirements, veterinary checkup schedules, and immunizations, among other factors.

These recommendations can help families find pets that will thrive in their homes.
