# Welcome to the 26th Annual Nashville Blooming Festival!

The Nashville Chamber of Commerce welcomes you to the 26th Annual Blooming Festival May 10-11 in downtown Nashville! Inside this publication you'll find the schedule of events along with information about the entire weekend of activities.

Amusement rides open Wednesday, May 8th at 5 p.m. in the parking lot next to the Nash County Courthouse. Wednesday and Thursday night, purchase a wristband for \$25 (per night) for unlimited rides from 5-10 p.m. Regular ticket prices apply Friday night, Saturday and Saturday night.

Thursday night, Nash Arts kicks off the weekend with a free live concert at the center located at 100 E. Washington Street featuring Miss Mini & the Sandman Band at 7 p.m.

Friday night, downtown comes alive with Sleeping Booty performing on the main stage outside, near the courthouse, from 7-11 p.m. Food vendors open early at 6 p.m. offering tasty festival food, and the amusement rides also open at 5 p.m.

Saturday morning, craft and exhibit booths open at 9 a.m. The 2024 Mother of the Year will be announced at 9:50 a.m. Curtis Joyner &

Resurrection will perform at 10 a.m. Saturday morning and the Blooming Festival Parade begins at 11:30 a.m.

After the parade, festival patrons will be entertained by East Coast Rhythm & Blues Band at 1 p.m. followed by Jim Quick & Coastline Band at 3:30 p.m.

Locally known performer Meredith Davis Johnson will perform at 5:30 p.m. and Chandler James along with his band perform from 6:30-7:30 p.m. and Easton Corbin in concert at 8:30 p.m.

Downtown will be filled with craft and exhibit booths Saturday, just in time to pick out a unique gift for Mother's Day or something for yourself! Of course all weekend food vendors will offer tasty festival cuisine that's sure to tempt your taste buds! Check inside for more information and activities.

### EASTON CORBIN CONCERT IS MAY 11TH

# FREE CONCERT MAY 11th ~ 8:30 p.m. • Downtown Nashville

Contributed – Easton Corbin has been gracing stages with his memorable baritone and unique blend of traditional and modern country music for more than a decade. The Florida native, who boasts two No. 1 singles with "A Little More Country Than That" and "Roll With It," embarks on a new musical chapter with his recent signing to Stone Country Records. Corbin teams with industry veterans Benny Brown, Paul Brown and Jason Sellers as the label's flagship artist.

Corbin says he and Music Row mainstay Benny Brown initially met and bonded over their mutual love of traditional country music. No stranger to the writing room himself, Corbin has penned songs with Sellers ahead of signing with the independent label. The singer, who has spent several years as an independent artist following nearly a decade with Mercury Nashville, says he's in a great position being Stone Country's flagship artist.

"They let me do what I want to do and let me be me, which is very important," the singer says.

Corbin's neotraditional sound shines through on "I Can't Decide," his debut single for the label. Soaring pedal steel and eargrabbing fiddle accompaniment combined with a driving beat, plucked guitar rhythms and Corbin's warm baritone further accentuate the up-tempo song.

Corbin wrote "I Can't Decide" three years ago with producer Wade Kirby and esteemed songwriters Ashley Gorley and Rhett Akins. The singer, who American Songwriter has praised as "one of those rare, glorious voices that was made for singing country," has been performing the song on the road since he wrote it and says "I Can't Decide" always grabs the audience's attention.

"I immediately knew it was something special," he says. "It's very contagious. I love the melody; I love the lyrics and to me it just feels like a hit."

Label boss Brown thought the same. "Benny is very involved and ['I Can't Decide'] rose to the top," Corbin says.

Corbin describes Brown as "a song guy," and it was Brown who suggested the singer team up with Kirby and Derek George as producers. "They bring a fresh sound," Corbin says of co-producers Kirby and George.

The Florida native continues to write with longtime producer Carson Chamberlain as well as Kirby, Shane Minor, Adam Craig and Wyatt McCubbin, who he penned the romantic wedding song "Marry That Girl" with. Corbin says the past three years have allowed him to focus more seriously on writing music and finding the message he wants to convey to listeners on his forthcoming project.

"It's about being authentic and that's what I try to shoot for when I write or record," he says. "I keep one foot in traditional and one foot in the modern and marry those two. That's really been my motto through the years."

And he's had a successful time doing so. Throughout his career, Corbin has amassed seven top 10 singles and three American Country Awards. Named Billboard's 2010 Top New Country Artist, Corbin has never shied away from his traditional roots with Your Big Sky complimenting his "unapologetic and unwavering traditional country sound." His self-titled debut album was named Country Breakthrough Album of the Year by iTunes Rewind Best of 2010 while American Songwriter has complimented the singer's "warm, smooth-as-gravy-southern drawl."

Along the way, Corbin hasn't forgotten his roots. The young boy who grew up listening to Merle Haggard and Hank Williams with his grandparents remembers where he came from.

"I do love traditional country music," he says. "That sound is what drew me to country music as a genre. One of my very first records was a Merle Haggard album when I was a kid. The way he delivered a song, the emotion in his songwriting and in his voice, he was just the whole package."

As Corbin embarks on his next chapter with Stone Country Records, the singer promises to honor those roots and says "I Can't Decide" is just a taste of what's to come.

"I think it's a good mixture of the traditional and modern," he says of the upcoming project. "It's a good mixture of that uptempo, midtempo, a few ballads here and there. That song is a good representation of what's coming. I'm really fired up about this brand new opportunity."

# Miss Mini & the Sandman Band

Grab your dancing shoes and head out to the Nash County Arts Council's annual Blooming Festival kick off with Miss Mini & the Sandman Band for the best in Motown, Top 40, Beach and more on Thursday, May 9th from 7-9 p.m. This project is supported by the North Carolina Arts Council, a division of the Department of Natural & Cultural Resources and the City of Rocky Mount. Together since 2015, this high energy band combines more than a century and a half of musical talent with a lineup that includes your favorite cover music and a few original songs!

A chubby baby, born in Rocky Mount, Catrese Green West was given the nickname "Minnesota Fats" by her grandmother, which eventually shortened to "Mini" and stuck with her over the years. Her musical journey began by singing with her father in 1990 with James Parker's Electric Image Band, with whom she had the opportunity to travel throughout the Southern United States and be exposed to diverse audiences and music genres.

She has formed her own band and released her own music. Her "Can't Stop Me" album, released in 2015, produced her hit single "Ole School Style," which reached #1 on Soul Dog's Smokin' Top 45 Southern Soul Hits countdown for two months straight and, along with other album singles, continue to receive national airplay on Beach and Southern Soul stations.

Miss Mini has performed at Blues festivals alongside greats such as Roy C., Maurice Wynn, and Clarence Carter and has filled guest spots with the likes of Jim Quick & the Coastline Band, Big Time Party Band, and the Marsha Morgan Band. She was opener for the 2016 Carolina Beach Music Awards and was nominated for Best Female Vocalist, Best Club Song, and Best Debut in the 2016 Daddy B. Nice Southern Soul awards alongside industry veterans Ms. Jody and Nellie Tiger Travis.

Her most recent song, "Put Something Cold in Your Hand," released just this Spring, is available for streaming in most digital music platforms.





a.m. and some earlier, so get here early!

The route will begin at the intersection of First and Washington Streets, then turn from Washington to Alston at the Corner of CVS Pharmacy. The parade will again turn at the corner of Alston and Church and pass by Cooley

Library. It will then turn on Boddie Street and proceed by the main stage returning to Elm Street.

The parade will include clowns, fire trucks, beautiful floats and marching bands as the 26th annual Blooming Festival parade kicks off at 11:30 a.m. May 11th.

Parade participants also include local churches and organizations plus many other enjoyable entries. Returning Sudan favorites include the Dunn Clowns, small cars or prowlers as well as monster trucks and animated animals!


Children watching the parade may be treated to something sweet as well. Parade participants are sure to be tossing candy while cruising down the parade route.

Delivered with precision by front man Jim Quick and his band, this group captures the true, honest spirit of traditions born and bred in the small southern towns of America.

These musicians, whose talents have landed them numerous awards in the

industry, bring this indigenous music to life in the most genuine way possible. Quick explained it best when he said "I want my music to be a bridge for many genres; a place where traditional and contemporary music can unite. But, I do love the pure emotion and simple-yet-deep concepts of roots music.

I'm a Southern boy and it all hits home; the lyrics and heart of the music, from the melodies to chord progressions, it all seems to strike an ancestral nerve with me."

The band currently maintains an average of 250 tour dates per year, with an ever-growing fan base that is as diverse as the music of the band itself.



### Chandler James & the Banned

Nashville native Chandler James will open for Easton Corbin at the 26th Nashville Blooming Festival. His show will run from 6:30 - 7:30 p.m.

Chandler James, 22, now resides in Nashville, Tennessee where he has steady gigs along Music Row and also stays busy in the recording studio.

Determined to remember his roots, James finds his inspiration from artists such as Chris Stapleton and Brent Cobb.

Chandler James Music blends outlaw, classic country with hints of southern rock and blues. He released his debut EP in 2020, followed by a string of singles, including the recent release of "Can't Blame it on the Truck."

Performing countless shows, Chandler James splits time between touring his home state, advocating for North Carolina agriculture and local products, and embracing Music City, Nashville, Tennessee.


